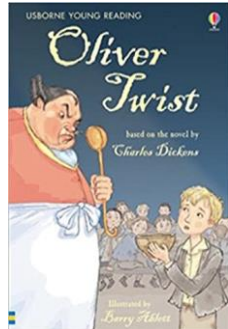

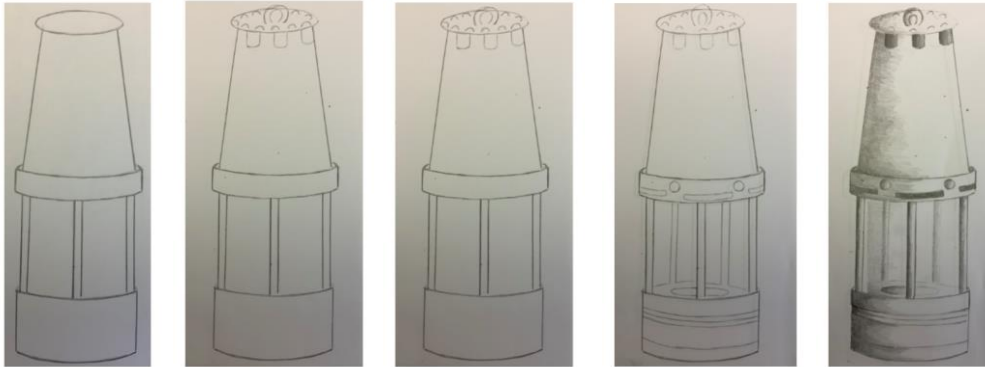
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Spelling – Unit 9

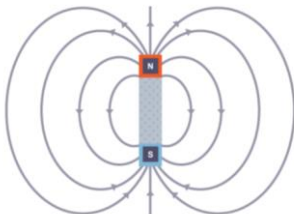
Well-being lesson – How to deal with change

HIIT (High Intensity Interval Training)– Mrs Thomas

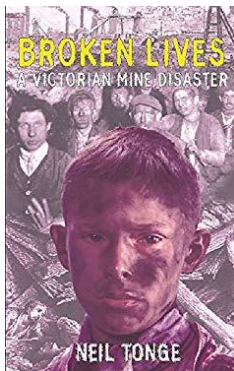
Science – Thursday Afternoon 1:45 – 2:30pm
